Teaching immigrant students in compulsory education

Comenius in-service training course for teachers and administrators

What?

The main objective of the course is to become familiar with the best practices in immigrants' education and to implement these into one's own work.

Participants will receive an insight into migrants' education in Finland and will compare this with other countries' education practices, policies and systems.

Participants will receive an understanding of how Finland, as the number one PISA country, takes care of immigrants in compulsory education.

The course theme will be explored in keynotes and workshops, relevant material will be presented, expertise will be exchanged, and good practice will be highlighted. The course will also be ideal for networking and creating useful contacts e.g. for the exchange of best practice and for possible future Comenius projects.

Where?

The course venue is a historical building that used to be a factory in the past but is currently a conference centre with restaurants. The location of the venue is in the centre of the city and in a walking distance from your hotel.

When?

The course will be organised on 6. – 10.5.2013, week 19/2013. A more detailed programme can be found below.

To whom?

Teachers (Pre-school, primary, secondary, vocational, adult, special needs), teacher trainers, careers officers, educational guides and counsellors, inspectors, headteachers/principals/managers of schools/organisations offering adult education.

How?

During the course participants will use a variety of methodologies in order to achieve the objectives. During the course there will be presentations that will provide the basis for group work. Specialists will give lectures related to immigrants' education. Participants will visit local schools to see the pedagogy in practice by observing lessons and discussing with Finnish teachers.

In the programme there will be reserved time for participants to exchange their personal ideas and interests with each other. Also, meetings with Finnish teachers will be arranged to learn about the PISA winning country's professionals' expertise and know-how.

Costs?

Course fee is 750 euros including a warm daily meal, coffee/tea with snacks every day and a get-together dinner on Monday evening. In addition, the course fee covers bus transportations from your hotel to visiting venues and a voluntary guided walking tour in the city on Tuesday evening.

Participants need to book their travel and accommodation themselves, but information will be supplied.

Please, note that the course is suitable for a Comenius Grant (school education).

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How to apply?

6. Sign the application and send it together with the Letter of Pre-Inspection and this Course Description PDF to your LLP National Agency.
